

Cape Disappointment State Park Ilwaco, WA

→ 108 miles

Take Highway 101 N to Ilwaco, WA. Continue straight onto Spruce St W and turn left onto 2nd Ave SW. Continue onto WA-100 South/Robert Gray Drive. The park entrance is at a four-way stop. Turn right to get a pass at the ranger station and see the oceanside Confluence features. Turn left at that four-way stop to see Baker Bay side sites, including the Fish Cleaning Table. Note: This Washington State Park requires a Discover Pass, \$30 Annual or \$10 One Day.

Vancouver Land Bridge

Vancouver, WA

 \rightarrow 20 miles

The main entrance is on Columbia Way Blvd. at Old Apple Tree Park. From I-5, take Highway 14 east and take Exit 1 for SE Columbia Way toward Vancouver National Historic Reserve. Keep right, follow signs for S/Southeast Columbia Way. Turn right and drive west to the sign for Old Apple Tree Park. Park and walk under the overpass to the Welcome Gate of the Land Bridge. The Land Bridge can also be accessed from the North at Fort Vancouver National Historic Site.

Sandy River Delta

Troutdale, OR

 \rightarrow 80 miles

The Sandy River Delta is just north of I-84 off Exit 18. Driving east, exit the freeway and turn right at the T, go under the overpass and enter the park at the sign. If you're driving west on I-84, take Exit 18 and take an immediate right. At the parking lot, look for the gravel path marked "Confluence Trail." Follow the path for 1.2 miles to reach the Bird Blind.

Celilo Park

near The Dalles, OR

 \rightarrow 128 miles

Celilo Park is located on the Columbia River, just north of I-84 off Exit 97. Turn north off the exit and cross the railroad tracks. When the proposed Confluence Project here is completed it will be located at the west end of the park.

Sacajawea State Park Pasco, WA

 \rightarrow 115 miles

From Highway 12 in Pasco, WA, follow Sacajawea Park Rd to the park entrance. The Confluence Story Circles are in the treed area where the two rivers meet.

Note: This Washington State Park requires a Discover Pass, \$30 Annual or \$10 One Day. The park is open April 1 to October 31.

Chief Timothy Park Clarkston, WA

Chief Timothy Park is an island just off Highway 12, 9 miles west of Clarkston, WA. After passing through the park entrance, drive to the T and turn left. The trail to the Confluence Listening Circle begins at the north end of the farthest parking lot.
